CORE-1:

- The course will illustrate how microeconomic concepts can be applied to analyze real-life situations. **CORE-II:**
- The objective of this sequence is to transmit the body of basic mathematics that enables the study of economic theory at the undergraduate level.
- In this course, particular economic models are not the ends, but the means for illustrating the method of applying mathematical techniques to economic theory in general.

  CORE-III:

- This course aims to introduce the students to the basic concepts of Macroeconomics.
- It discusses the preliminary concepts associated with the determination and measurement of aggregate macroeconomic variables like savings, investment, GDP, money, inflation, and the balance of payments.

## **CORE-IV:**

• The objective of this paper is similar to that of core-ii. This paper tries to interpret the mathematical interpretation of economic model, specifically the courses on microeconomic theory, macroeconomic theory, statistics and econometrics etc.

## **CORE-V:**

- The course is designed to provide a sound training in microeconomic theory to formally analyze the behavior of individual agents.
- Since students are already familiar with the quantitative techniques in the previous semesters, mathematical tools are used to facilitate understanding of the basic concepts; this course looks at the behavior of the consumer and the producer and also covers the behavior of a competitive firm.

  CORE-VI:
- This course introduces the students to formal modeling of a macro-economy in terms of analytical tools.
- It discusses various alternative theories of output and employment determination in a closed economy in the short run as well as long run and its policy implications.

## **CORE-VII:**

- It begins with some basic concepts and terminology that are fundamental to statistical analysis and inference.
- It deals with the study of measure relationship between variables that are the core of economic analysis. This is followed by a basic discussion on index numbers, time series, the notion of probability, followed by the most frequently used theoretical distribution i.e. the Normal distribution.

  CORE-VIII:
- The emphasis will be on giving conceptual clarity to the student coupled with the use of mathematical tools and reasoning.
- It covers Market, general equilibrium and welfare, imperfect markets and topics under information economics.

## **CORE-IX:**

- In this course, the students are introduced to the long run dynamic issues like growth and technical progress.
- It also provides the micro-foundations to the various aggregative concepts used in the previous course.

## **CORE-X:**

- The course is to develop a research orientation among the students and to acquaint them with fundamentals of research methods.
- Specifically, the course aims at introducing them to the basic concepts used in research and to scientific social research methods and their approach. It includes discussions on sampling techniques, research designs and techniques of analysis.

### CORE-XI:

- Using appropriate analytical frameworks, this course reviews major trends in economic indicators and policy debates in India in the post-Independence period.
- It also emphasizes on paradigm shifts and turning points.

## CORE-XII:

• The course begins with a discussion of alternative conceptions of development and their justification. It then proceeds to aggregate models of growth and cross-national comparisons of the growth

The course ends by linking political institutions to growth and inequality by discussing the role of the state in economic development and the informational and incentive problems that affect state governance.

## COURSE OUTCOMES: POLITICAL SCIENCE HONOURS:

## CORE-I:

- This course is divided into two sections. Section 'A' introduces the students to the idea of political theory, its history and approaches and an assessment of its critical and contemporary trends.
- Section 'B' is designed to reconcile political theory and practices through reflections on the ideas and practices related to democracy.

## CORE-II:

- This course acquaints students with the Constitutional design of state structures and institutions, and their actual working over time.
- It also traces the embodiment of some of these conflicts in constitutional provisions, and shows how these have played out in political practice and encourages a study of state institutions in their mutual interaction, and in interaction with the larger extra-constitutional environment. CORE-III:
- This course is divided into two sections. Section A helps the student familiarize with the basic normative concepts of political theory.
- Section B introduces the students to the important debates in the subject. These debates prompt us to consider that there is no settled way of understanding concepts and that in the light of new insights and challenges, besides newer ways of perceiving and interpreting the world around us, we inaugurate new modes of Political debates. CORE-IV:
- This course maps the working of 'modern' institutions, premised on the existence of an individuated society, in a context marked by communitarian solidarities, and their mutual transformation thereby.
- It also familiarizes students with the working of the Indian state, paying attention to the contradictory dynamics of modern state power.

## CORE-V:

- This is a foundational course in comparative politics. The purpose is to familiarize students with the basic concepts and approaches to the study of comparative politics.
- More specifically the course will focus on examining politics in a historical framework while engaging with various themes of comparative analysis in developed and developing countries.
- The course provides an introduction to the discipline of public administration. This paper encompasses public administration in its historical context with an emphasis on the various classical and contemporary administrative theories.
- The course also explores some of the recent trends, including feminism and ecological conservation and how the call for greater democratization is restructuring public administration. It will also attempt to provide the students a comprehensive understanding on contemporary administrative

## **CORE-VII:**

This paper seeks to equip students with the basic intellectual tools for understanding International

Relations. It introduces students to some of the most important theoretical approaches for studying international relations.

• The course begins by historically contextualizing the evolution of the international state system before discussing the agency-structure problem through the levels-of analysis approach. It provides a fairly comprehensive overview of the major political developments and events starting from the twentieth century. The key objective of the course is to make students aware of the implicit Eurocentralism of International Relations by highlighting certain specific perspectives from the Global South.

## **CORE-VIII:**

- In this course students will be trained in the application of comparative methods to the study of politics.
- This course aims to introduce undergraduate students to some of the range of issues, literature, and methods that cover comparative political scenario.

### CORE-IX

- The paper seeks to provide an introduction to the interface between public policy and administration in India.
- It deals with issues of decentralization, financial management, citizens and administration and social welfare from a non-western perspective.

## **CORE-X:**

- This course introduces students to the key debates on the meaning and nature of globalization by addressing its political, economic, social, cultural and technological dimensions.
- It also offers insights into key contemporary global issues such as the proliferation of nuclear weapons, ecological issues, international terrorism, and human security before concluding with a debate on the phenomenon of global governance.

## **CORE-XI:**

• This course goes back to Greek antiquity and familiarizes students with the manner in which the political questions were first posed. Machiavelli comes as an interlude inaugurating modern politics followed by Hobbes and Locke, Rousseau, Marx. This is a basic foundation course for students.

### CORE-XII:

- This course introduces the specific elements of Indian Political Thought spanning over two millennia. The basic focus of study is on individual thinkers whose ideas are however framed by specific themes.
- The course as a whole is meant to provide a sense of the broad streams of Indian thought while encouraging a specific knowledge of individual thinkers and texts. Selected extracts from some original texts are also given to discuss in class. The list of Reference books is meant for teachers as well as the more interested students.

### **CORE-XIII:**

- Philosophy and politics are closely intertwined. Students will be exposed to the manner in which the questions of politics have been posed in terms that have implications for larger questions of thought and existence. Contemporary political philosophy and debates are introduced to the students here. CORE-XIV:
- This course introduces a wide span of Thinkers and themes that defines the modernity of Indian political thought.
- The objective is to study general themes that have been produced by thinkers from varied social and temporal contexts. Selected extracts from original texts are also given to discuss in the class.
